### Love Yourself, Love God, Love Others- The Enneagram Summer Series

Sunday Morning Small Group Offering, July 9-August 27, at 10:15 am

I know what you are thinking: the Ennea-what? The Enneagram is a tool that is used to help people grow toward maturity in Christ. It is based on 9 basic personality types and has an uncanny accuracy in describing how human

beings are wired, both positively and negatively. At first, the enneagram appears to be just another personality inventory, something akin to the Myers-Briggs. However, once you learn about it, you begin to realize that this is a tool with great depth and strong understanding of not only our strengths but what Richard Rohr calls our "shadow" side as well - those areas where we tend to fall into sin and brokenness.



The Enneagram brings about a deeper knowledge of ourselves, compassion for others, and love for God, since it not only helps you learn more about yourself, but it also helps you to see the world through other people's eyes, understanding how and why people think, feel, and act the way they do. By exploring the Enneagram, you will be able to better understand yourself in the unique way God has created you. You will learn about why you behave the way you do, and get specific direction for individual growth.

This summer series will last for 8 weeks and is designed to accommodate busy summer schedules. All the Sunday Morning Small Groups are invited to come together for this series. We know many people in our congregation will be in and out this summer, but we hope you will join us when you can. The Teaching Team and I thought that learning our personality types together could be fun and also deepen our community as we come to know and understand each other. We also felt like in this time of polarization in our country any tool that can help us talk to people who are not like us is a really good thing! To make the study more interactive, we are going to meet around tables in the parlor and we have asked our facilitator, Rev. Dr. Wallis Landrum to make it very interactive and conversational. Wallis is a minister in the Presbyterian tradition and has five years of training in the Enneagram. We look forward to hearing from him this summer!
