


Don't Miss the Afternoon at the Farm Sunday, October 21st

Why I started using the word "Progressive" to describe our church?

This week in my sermon I called First Baptist a "progressive Christian church." For years, I resisted using "progressive" to describe our church, because I am not completely comfortable with that label. It needs an asterisk. I don't like that it has been used primarily in the political arena. So, for six years I have avoided using it. However, when I introduce myself as the pastor at First Baptist Church, the most common reaction I get is some variation of... "I didn't think Baptist churches had female pastors." I usually go on to explain that we are unique and yes, only 6-9% of Baptist churches have female pastors. We are unique in other ways too. Of

the hundreds of churches in Columbia, only 4-5 are fully inclusive of LGBTQ folks. And theologically, while we emphasis the life and teachings of Jesus, we don't fear questions or doubts. Typically, when I explain all this, people say, "Wow. I didn't know there was a Baptist church like that in Columbia." All of this makes us unique and the truth is compared to other churches it also makes us progressive. Consequently, after six years, I have finally come to believe that we should just claim the label progressive, even with the difficulty it presents. So, as we move through the visioning process this fall, I want to think more about how we claim this label and spread the word that a church like ours does exist. Carl Mc Estar
