Annual Sheppard Lecture October 19-20

This fall, for our annual Sheppard Lecture, First Baptist will welcome Jared Byas.

Along with Pete Enns, Jared is the co-host of the popular podcast, The Bible for Normal People and co-author of Genesis for Normal People: A Guide to the Most Controversial, Misunderstood, and Abused Book of the Bible. Jared has been a teaching pastor and professor. He has taught courses and developed curricula in philosophy, ethics, & biblical studies.

Jared will be speaking about the Bible- what it is and what we do with it. Because let's be honest, as Baptists, we love the Bible, but the Bible is sometimes hard to understand and even disturbing in places. Still, we believe in the importance of the Bible and its life-changing power. So, with Jared's help, we are going to seek to understand it more fully.






Inspired: Slaying Giants, Walking on Water, and Loving the Bible Again


If the Bible isn't a science book or an instruction manual, then what is it? What do people mean when they say the Bible is inspired? When Rachel Held Evans found herself asking these questions, she began a quest to better understand what the Bible is and how it is meant to be read. What she discovered changed her—and it will change you too.

The Bible Tells Me So...Why Defending Scripture Has Made Us Unable To Read It

Trained as an evangelical Bible scholar, Peter Enns loved the Scriptures and shared his devotion. But the further he studied the Bible, the more he found himself confronted by questions that could not be answered within the rigid framework of his religious instruction. The Bible Tells Me So chronicles Enns' spiritual odyssey, how he came to see beyond restrictive doctrine and learned to embrace God's Word as it is actually written, "inspiring and uplifting . . . but just as often a challenging book that leaves you with more questions than answers." As he explores questions progressive evangelical readers of Scripture commonly face yet fear voicing, Enns reveals that they are the very questions that God wants us to consider—the essence of our spiritual study.

I want to let you know that after a lot of consideration, I am resigning from my position as Director of Children's Ministry. My last Sunday will be May 26.






Unidiversity Youth Camp

The Envelope Challenge is a way to help make sure that every student who wants




