



Moments of Hope

Last week, Pastor Carol, Associate Pastor Michael, and I ventured to Birmingham, Alabama for the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship's General Assembly. CBF General Assembly is one of my favorite events because I get to hear about all the incredible things happening in the life of our Fellowship. Last week, I witnessed as over 50 individuals gathered around tables to plan next steps for the Affirming Network of CBF. I heard stories about how different churches



are working toward racial justice. I saw the incredible work our field personnel are doing around the world. I celebrated as our Pastor was voted to be the moderator-elect of the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship, the highest elected position within the CBF (be sure to congratulate her!)

Another highlight was the workshop Carol and I co-led about Experiential Worship at First Baptist. There we collaborated with other ministers about how they could begin to implement liturgical art and experiential worship within their own congregations. (Special thanks to Michael for troubleshooting our technology problems and ensuring that the workshop was a success!) Around 100 people attended to hear all of the creative work we have done together. It's always fun to brag about you, First Baptist! I enjoyed getting to talk about all the creative things we've done together, whether that was making hundreds of stars for Advent or drawing in ashes during Lent. Being a part of a creative and participatory congregation is something I will cherish forever.

I also found General Assembly life-giving. It provided a time to catch up with friends whom I had not seen in a year. I had the chance to converse with former seminary professors, get dinner with friends from college, and share stories with Pastoral Residents from around the country. It gave space to dream, hope, and celebrate together. To be honest, searching for a pastorate is exhausting. CBF General Assembly allowed me to talk with other ministers who are in the trenches of the search, as well as network with state coordinators and CBF personnel. One of my highlights was when Pam Durso, Executive Director of Baptist Women in Ministry (pictured above center), introduced me to Wendy Peacock, Pastor of Fellowship Baptist Church, Americus, Georgia (pictured above left). Wendy has been a Pastor for 25 years. Wendy's story gives me hope. CBF gives me hope. And most of all, you, First Baptist, give me hope.

Thank you for giving me the time to go to the General Assembly. I hope you will make plans to attend next year, in Atlanta, Georgia, as we celebrate what God is doing in the Fellowship.

Youth Ministry Workshop Summer Small Group


June 9- July 21 10:15 am, 2nd Floor Conference Room
