
Summer Book Club Discussion Groups


10:15 am September 8-October 13



Brittany McDonald Null, our former Pastoral Resident, will now hold the role of Interim Assistant Pastor. Brittany will be overseeing Children, Traditional Worship, and College ministry, as well as assisting with missions and pastoral care. In her oversight with the Children's Ministry, Brittany will coordinate Sunday morning Sunday School and extended sessions, serve as the staff liaison to the Children's Ministry Action Group, coordinate with the Director of the

Nursery and communicate with families about children's ministry activities. Brittany is excited to lean into the visioning provided during the Church Wide Visioning and work with parents, volunteers, and families, as we learn how to best journey alongside our young people.

Brittany's oversight in Traditional worship includes assisting the Pastor each week to plan the services, coordinating with the Interim Music Director - Traditional Worship to select music that aligns with the week's theme, overseeing the Scholarship Singers, preparing bulletins for both services, and serving as the staff liaison to the Worship Team.

Her final area of focus with be the collegiate ministry. Brittany will plan and implement college ministry activities, including Sunday Night Gatherings, fellowship events, and the annual Christmas Party. Additionally, Brittany will be assisting Associate Pastor Michael McEntyre and the Missions Team with benevolence requests and planning a Missions Partner Tour this fall. She will also provide pastoral care in the absence of the Senior Pastor.

The interim time will also add some new responsibilities for our Associate Pastor, Michael McEntyre. In addition to working with our students and being the liaison for our Serving Team, Michael will oversee the administrative tasks for the church. He will be working closely with the Trustees, Finance, Personnel, and Endowment teams to help with the day to day operations of the church, the long-range facility goals and current repair projects, care of buildings

and ground, the budgeting process and financial accountability, and office needs. Michael will also work with our support staff to help them as they provide the foundational work that all First Baptist ministries build from to be successful.

While these responsibilities will provide new challenges and demands, Michael is confident that, together with First Baptist teams and leadership, this will be a time of growth and opportunity. Michael also looks forward to continuing the good work started this summer in the small group workshop on rethinking our approach to Children's and Student Ministry. He is equally excited about a new semester of growing in faith with First Baptist students, finding new ways to engage the congregation in missions and serving opportunities, and having a front row seat to what God is doing in the lives of college students and young adults here at First Baptist.



Back to School at First Baptist 2019

As a new school year begins, there are some very practical ways we, as a church, can better connect to students who visit our congregation. We published this last year and many of you said you thought it was helpful so here it is again:



- Don't ask students if this is their first Sunday, instead say something like, "I don't believe we've met, I'm _____, are you a student?"
- When you meet a student for the first time, make a note of their name (write it in your bulletin or text it to yourself). Make a point to pray for that student all during the next week. You will bless them and when you see them the next week, it will be easier to remember their name.
- Try not to redirect students by saying something like, "You need to meet Michael/ Brittany/ our College Minister", start with getting to know them yourself. Ask what they are studying. Find out where they are from. Look for ways to connect. Then introduce them to the appropriate staff (or better yet, take them to lunch and tell them you will introduce them to us when they come back next week.)
- If someone asks you about our Sunday Morning Small Groups, don't show them the options in the bulletin, invite them to join you and take them along. You can share the different options available afterwards. Remember, we do not have a separate College Sunday Morning Small Group by design. We want students to begin to integrate into the larger church, and Small Groups are a great way for them to connect with other adults in our congregation.
- Be aware of students visiting your small group. Know that making them feel welcome is as important as the lesson that morning.
- If you have the gift of the gab and see a student sitting by themselves, introduce yourself and ask if you can join them. As the service goes along, you can offer explanations for our worship practices (i.e. why does the cross process in, what happens during Passing of the Peace, why do we go forward for communion in Awakening, why is our pastor a woman- you know, the easy questions.)
- Also, for our home students who have headed off to school, make a point to send a note of encouragement to them in the weeks ahead. If you can't find their address, give the note to their parents or to Brittany or Michael to send. You will not believe how important it is for them to know they are remembered.

These are just a few simple thoughts to keep us moving in the right direction. Ministry works better together. If you have any further thoughts or want to get involved with this process on a deeper level, please be sure to contact Michael or Brittany.



Letter from Mary VanRheenen & Keith Holmes

August 2019

Do you sweat before breakfast? A friend of ours who grew up in East Africa wanted to make sure he lived somewhere where he would not have to sweat before breakfast. I've been thinking about him a lot lately as I sweat before, during, and after breakfast.

Keith and I are on the Caribbean Island of Curacao[i] for 6+ weeks to record the New Testament in Papiamentu, the local language. We've rented an apartment which is cool enough with the windows open and the constant sea winds blowing through. But I am still sweating.



Now Keith is sweating, too, in a more figurative sense. Today we completed 90% of the recording finished. The remaining 10%, though, is mainly lines scattered here and there—the angel Gabriel in Luke; King Agrippa in Acts; one of the Elders in Revelation. Once everything in a chapter is recorded, that whole chapter needs to be listened to and approved. If not approved, readers need to be called back in to record the corrections. We have already listened to and approved 30 chapters, out of a total of 260. Everyone has worked hard to get this far. Frankly, we're tired. Pray with us that we will all finish strong. Our partners in Moldova have also seen progress. The Romany church in Vulcanesti has grown. Romany leaders are evangelizing other Romany and dreaming of their own Bible school. Our partners, Petru & Olesea Ciochina, have also worked hard. And they are also tired. Pray with them that they will lean on the Holy Spirit's unlimited power.




