

Pentecost Sunday is frequently referred to as the Birthday of the Church. It is the time when people from many nationalities and cultures gathered together in one place and the Holy Spirit descended upon the entire house. The Spirit appeared in fire and wind so the liturgical color for Pentecost is red. Decorations most often take on the color of flames, orange, yellow and red. The visual enhancement on the stage was the collaboration of Brenda Rice and Ed Rollins. Assisting in the creation were Lisa and David Lang, and Jennifer Showalter. The letters are haphazardly arranged to symbolize the many languages represented by the people who experienced the first Pentecost. Additionally, many of the letters are wrapped in newsprint, further symbolizing the chaos of our world. In the midst of our chaos, our multiple nationalities and cultures, the Spirit of Christ has descended to each of us to provide "unity" through Christ.

Vacation Bible School, June 9-12


