## Palm Sunday - April 5

Palm Sunday is a joyous day at First Baptist. Children are invited to take part in a Palm Sunday processional at the beginning of both Awakening (9:15 am) and Traditional (11:15 am) worship; parents please bring your children to the back of the worship space a few minutes before worship, so they can receive a palm leaf and join the processional. First Baptist will also participate in the Downtown Palm Sunday Service in conjunction with other area churches. This special service takes place in the middle of the street on Broadway. We will meet on the front lawn at 10:20 and walk down together. Children will need to be brought by their caregivers.

## Good Friday Service - April 10, 6:00 pm

We will gather in the Fellowship Hall at 6:00 pm for worship. Good Friday is the day that we commemorate the suffering and execution of Jesus by the Romans occupying empire in Jerusalem. We will gather around the cross to sing, pray and reflect together on all that Jesus means to us. We will continue our Lenten theme of *Journey through Lent with Art* with a meditation of Jesus on the cross. Childcare is available.

## Easter Egg Hunt - April 11, 10:00 am

We will gather in the Fellowship Hall at 10:00 am. Be sure to bring your own baskets! Kids will enjoy crafts, games, treats, and hunting for Easter Eggs.



**For Children During Worship:**

Birth-Kindergarteners can be checked in at the nursery, located next to the sanctuary, where they will be cared for by our professional staff.

1<sup>st</sup>- 5<sup>th</sup> Graders are encouraged to participate in worship with their family.

**10:15 Spiritual Formation Hour:**

Birth-Age 3 Childcare is provided by our professional staff in the nursery, which is located next to the sanctuary.

First Kids Sunday School (3 years old through 5th grade) is on the third floor.

Youth Bible Study (grades 6-12) is on the third floor.

Adult Small Groups are located on the second floor:

- Color of Compromise Group (Conference Room) This study explores American Church complicity in racism. A video recaps one chapter each week followed by discussion. Prior reading isn't required, and all are welcome.
- Faith Forum (Elevator Lobby Classroom) is a diverse group that likes to read the lesson for the day together, share information, and ask questions to learn from one another.
- Connections Group (office commons) is made up of younger adults. They spend time building community, sharing life, and often take on heady theological topics.
