In-Person Worship Update

In preparation for this day, the Church Council has continued to meet regularly to discuss worship plans for the colder weather. *After much prayer and reflection, the council decided to offer a modified, in-person/online worship opportunity in the Sanctuary beginning Sunday, November 22. Throughout the winter, we will have one Combined Worship service at 11:15, which will be held in the Sanctuary and broadcasted live via webcast.* Please understand that this service, like our outdoor service, will look quite a bit different from normal to provide as much safety as possible.

Christian Mindfulness – Sunday Evenings Starting Today

Beginning today at 5:00 pm, Dr. Irene Kraegel is going to be with us via Zoom for 4 workshops called *Present to God: Christian Mindfulness Worship*. Grounded in Biblical theology, mindfulness theory, and clinical psychology, this series of four workshops, which Irene Kraegel will present, provides practical mindfulness experience that will equip participants to manage unpleasant emotions effectively and to fully engage with the life God has provided. The workshop is created to be down-to-earth in tone, engaging both the hearts and minds of participants - a great gift to people looking for mental health tools that can be applied within their journey of Christian discipleship. You do not need to register. The link will be sent out each Thursday before a session.

Special Post-Election Zoom at Noon

Next Wednesday, no matter who wins the election or if we are still waiting for the results, regardless of your political affiliation or how you voted, you may find yourself needing a chance to seek peace and some refuge in the presence of God. On November 4 at Noon, I am hosting a special post-election Zoom at Noon.
