Church Business Meeting

Sunday, April 18, 1:00 pm via Zoom

On Sunday, April 18 at 1:00 pm, First Baptist will gather for a special called Business Meeting via Zoom. Thanks to the hard work of our Finance Committee, the Stepping Toward 200 Taskforce (a team created by the Church Council in 2019), and our Church Council, a motion is being presented to the church to pay off the remaining building debt from our Building Tomorrow Today campaign. Thanks to the generosity of our congregation and recent gifts to our Legacy Giving funds, we have the opportunity to retire our approximate remaining debt of \$375,000. This will save us roughly \$50,000 per year in debt services. The Business Meeting will lay out the path on how this will be accomplished and ask the church to vote to approve the retirement of this loan. We hope all our members will take part in this good work.

ForColumbia is back and gearing up to serve our city on June 5, 2021. First Baptist will be leading 2 projects this year, but there are a variety of opportunities across the city to chose from, with various levels of Covid awareness and sensitivity to meet a variety of volunteer needs.

Our project at Benton Elementary will include enhancing the outdoor learning space, assembling a chicken coop, planting flowers, putting up fencing, spreading mulch, painting play elements, and putting together picnic tables. We are also looking for an old boat or canoe that could be partially buried and added to the area. Our project at our Extra Mile house will have two main areas to serve. Part of our team will be outdoors helping with general clean up, planting flowers, and sealing the deck. This part of the project is outside, and it is possible to maintain social distance most of the time. The other part of our team will be demolishing and removing old ceilings and wall coverings as well as removing some carpeting in an effort to prep the area for future renovation. This part of the project requires N95 masks, gloves, and safety glasses to protect from dust and particles and is not family friendly. This project is inside with limited social distancing.
