2020 is a bit different, but thanks to technology, we are still planning our annual Sheppard Lecture. Beginning Sunday, November 1 at 5:00 pm, Dr. Irene Kraegel is going to be with us via Zoom for 4 workshops called Present to God: Christian Mindfulness Worship.

Sessions include information-sharing, guided practice, and group discussion as appropriate. The Mindful Christian book is recommended (but not required) for participants as a workshop accompaniment. Each session will include time for connecting as a group at the beginning as well as debriefing at the end. Options will be given throughout for different types of engagement with the practices. Zoom link will be sent on Thursdays.

Important Worship Update

With the changing of the seasons, this past Sunday, October 25, was our last planned worship service on the front lawn. For the last three months, we have been blessed to have outdoor in-person worship together. We are grateful to have this beautiful space, which has been a wonderful venue offering our best option for gathering safely.

In preparation for this day, the Church Council has continued to meet regularly to discuss worship plans for the colder weather. After much prayer and reflection, the council decided to offer a modified, in-person/online worship opportunity in the Sanctuary beginning Sunday, November 22. Throughout the winter, we will have one Combined Worship service at 11:15, which will be held in the Sanctuary and broadcasted live via webcast. Please understand that this service, like our outdoor service, will look quite a bit different from normal to provide as much safety as possible. Please read the Important Notes below for more details.

We understand that there are risks involved with any indoor gathering during this season. As such, we are asking that you use your best judgement as to whether in-person worship is a good decision for you and your family. During this time of pandemic, we understand that what is best for many faithful First Baptist folks is to continue worshipping online and we bless and support that decision. For those who choose join in-person, we hope you will help make the in-person opportunity safe and meaningful.

Until November 22, when in-person worship begins, we will offer online worship only, which will go live at 11:15 am. The next few weeks will be spent preparing for combined in-person/online worship in the Sanctuary. We have purchased sanitizing equipment to help meet our needs. Pastor Michael McEntyre has ordered custom filters for the air handlers in the Sanctuary, which will help capture airborne particles down to 0.3 microns. We are also working to create improved airflow throughout the sanctuary, which may result in a draft, so congregants will want to plan on dressing accordingly.

Because of the evolving nature of the pandemic, these plans are subject to change and we will communicate as soon as alternate decisions are made. I am grateful to the Church Council and the church staff for their diligence and thoughtfulness throughout the pandemic. We have great leadership here at First Baptist! We know that these changes will feel different and are less than ideal, but thankfully, God's presence is with us exactly where we are, and for that we are grateful.

Important Notes About In-Person Worship

- The Sanctuary has been roped off in sections, which are 6 feet or more apart and distant from those leading. Seating for in-person worship will be by household.
- Everyone over the age of two must wear a mask that covers nose and mouth.
- Everyone must keep six feet of physical distance between households.
- There will be no congregational singing. The congregation is invited to hum along.
- Offering plates will not be passed during service. Offerings may be left in the box at the front of the sanctuary upon arrival, mailed to the church office, or given online.
- Restrooms are for emergencies only.
- The pastor will dismiss row by row following the benediction.
- Nursery and childcare will not be provided.
