In January, we invite you to join us for Winter Bible Study via Zoom! This 6-week course is designed for people who want to dig deeper in their Bible study and grow in their understanding of scripture.

Dr. Hulitt Gloer will be leading the course entitled "Reading Mark's Revolutionary Gospel." Knowing what Jesus said and did has never been more important than in the days in which we are now living. The Gospel of Mark tells of Jesus' revolutionary life and message and we will examine it together. The class is perfect for laity who want to study the Bible at a more scholarly level, but you do not have to be a scholar to join. The course is designed for any and all who desire a greater understanding of the Bible.

Dr. Hulitt Gloer is Emeritus Professor of Preaching and Christian Scriptures at Truett Theological Seminary, Baylor University and taught at Truett when Pastors Michael and Carol McEntyre were students there.

In the midst of uncertainty this year, your generosity is inspiring. Year-to-Date Giving Statements (through Nov) Being Mailed Out

The church will be sending out year-to-date giving statements through November this week in an effort to ensure that our contribution records match the personal records of those who have contributed this year. With all the changes we have seen in 2020, (a new accountant, the use of a new accounting program, an new Administrator and Treasurer, the necessity of mail-in donations and online giving, etc.) we want to make sure we are as accurate as possible with our records before sending out tax documents in 2021.

If you find any discrepancies in the statement, please contact Michael McEntyre for assistance. If no changes are required, any December contributions will be added to the statements and official tax documents will be sent out in January. If you have contributed to the church but do not receive a statement by Christmas, please contact the church and let us know.

Just as a reminder, for financial gifts to be included on your 2020 statement of charitable contributions, donations must be received in the church office by December 30 (as the office is closed on the 31) or dated and postmarked (either by mail or electronically if giving online) by December 31.
