

Lenten Series

Lent, the six-week period leading up to Easter begins February 17 with Ash Wednesday. Our Lenten Theme this year is Again & Again. In Lent, we're reminded that, again and again, suffering and brokenness find us. We doubt again, we lament again, we mess up again.

Again and again, the story of Jesus on the cross repeats—every time lives are taken unjustly, every time the powerful choose corruption and violence, every time individuals forget how to love. With exacerbation we exclaim, "Again?! How long, O God?" And yet, in the midst of the motion blur chaos of our lives, God offers a sacred refrain: "I choose you, I love you, I will lead you to repair." Again and again, God breaks the cycle and offers us a new way forward.



This theme provides a clear invitation in a time when much is unclear. Even if worshiping apart, we come to God again and again with our prayers, our dreams, our hopes, and our doubts. Even if from a distance, we will continue to be community to one another—especially when it's hard—by choosing each other over and over again. We will continue to love God with the same persistence God chooses and claims us.

In this season, we need rituals—both old and new—to remember and be transformed. Embodied practice builds muscle memory. Repetition helps retrain our neural pathways. We need the 46 days of Lent because this season shapes us into more faithful disciples. Join us this Lent as again and again, we bring all of who we are to God and trust that God will meet us, time and again, along the way.

These gifts were in honor of my year as Cooperative Baptist Fellowship Moderator, which is currently underway. They wanted to celebrate this accomplishment in a year when we have not been able to celebrate in a normal way. I was so grateful for this thoughtful expression of celebration.

Because we are not meeting in person, I have not had the opportunity to share my work as Moderator with you in the way that I wanted, but this is a great reminder for me to take a moment to catch you up. Since last July, I have been serving as Moderator. I meet weekly, most of the time, by phone or Zoom with Paul Baxley, the Executive Coordinator of CBF to serve as a sounding board and partner in the work of the Fellowship.

In 2020, I was also heavily involved in a strategic planning process for the Fellowship called *Toward Bold Faithfulness*, where we sought to listen deeply to the Spirit and the Fellowship regarding the needs in our communities and churches. We are now in the Response phase of that work and are making changes in the life of the Fellowship to respond to what we heard. In addition, I am currently serving on a think tank that is strategizing about what the new normal will be for churches once the pandemic finally lifts. We are hoping to make some recommendations to Fellowship churches about plans they should be putting in place now to get ready for the new normal.

These are just a few highlights. While this has not been the year of service that I dreamed about, I have had a chance to do some good work on the behalf of the Fellowship. Thank you for allowing me to serve the broader Church in this way.

Drive-Thru Lent Devotional Pick-up February 14 from 1:00-3:00 pm

This year, we are offering a Lenten Devotional put together by Sanctified Art. Beginning with Ash Wednesday, this weekly devotional follows the Revised Common Lectionary through Easter Sunday. Each week offers: scripture readings, biblical commentary, poetry, visual art, written reflections, and coloring pages. We encourage you to walk through these weekly readings at your own pace throughout the season, following the rhythm that works best for you. First Kids Families can also collect their Lent-at-Home bags at this time.



Ash Wednesday - February 17

Lent begins on February 17 with Ash Wednesday. This year, you will have two opportunities to mark the beginning of Lent. From Noon-1:00 pm Pastor Carol McEntyre will be in the church parking lot offering drive-by imposition of ashes. You will get a chance to see Pastor Carol and to receive the imposition of ashes. The marking of ashes in the shape of a cross on the foreheads of believers as a reminder of mortality and belonging and is how Christians begin the forty-day journey of Lent. At 6:30 pm, we will come together for a virtual Zoom worship experience. We will sing, hear scripture readings, and set our intentions for Lent.

Tuesday Evening Visio Divina Bible Study

Visio Divina, latin for "divine seeing," is a method of meditation, reflection, and prayer through a process of intentional seeing. Visio Divina extends the 6th century Benedictine practice of Lectio Divina by the use of visual imagery. Traditionally, Visio Divina was accompanied by Benedictine iconography and illuminations, however, different faith traditions have adapted the process over time, utilizing both secular and nonsecular images. During Lent, Pastor Brittany will be leading a Visio Divina Bible Study via Zoom at 7 pm. The meeting will be a blend of visual meditation with group discussion and bible study. Lent begins on February 17 with Ash Wednesday. This year, you will have two opportunities to mark the beginning of Lent.

Stations of the Cross Experience March 1-17

In addition to the virtual Lenten opportunities, we are also creating an in-person Stations of the Cross Experience, which will be set up in the Sanctuary open March 1-17. The Station of the Cross Experience honors the ancient story of Jesus' death while recognizing the ways this narrative repeats itself again and again throughout the past and present. It provides multi-sensory ways to engage, confess, and lament, creating a profound and prophetic worship experience. Designed by Rev. T. Denise Anderson, the service features her original artwork and artist statement, *Piet*à: "Woman, Behold Your Son; Behold Your Mother—a sermon project exploring the story of Mamie Till-Mobley (the mother of Emmett Till) and the grief of Mary, mother of Jesus, beholding her son on the cross. This tradition is so popular that Shrove Tuesday is also known as Pancake Day! Our

digital gathering will be a time for families to check in, eat pancakes (or whatever dinner works best for your family), hear briefly about our Lenten plans, play a simple Lenten-themed scavenger hunt, and most importantly see one another.
