### Word from the Pastor



First Baptist,

As you know on April 6, the Church Council met and moved to form a Discernment Committee dedicated to determining the future of the Child Development Center (CDC) at First Baptist. The CDC has been closed since the pandemic began and the



time has come to decide if it will remain permanently closed or if it will reopen. For over 50 years, CDC has been a ministry of First Baptist Church, and either of these decisions will require input and ownership from the church as a whole. Therefore, the Church Council decided to put together a Discernment Committee with broad representation from the church body.

The Discernment Committee is tasked with determining:

- If there is still a need for a Child Development Center like ours?
- If there is still a need, is it feasible to reopen CDC?
- Finally, if it is feasible, does the church want to invest in reopening and maintaining CDC?

As of last week, the Discernment Committee has been recruited and is beginning their work. The Discernment Committee includes: Patty Cornell (chair), Ken Hammann, Russ Scott, Myra Galloway and Noah Hartsfield. As Pastor of Families, Brittany McDonald Null will serve as the staff liason to the committee. We are grateful for their willingness to serve. We invite you to be in prayer for them as they begin their work. Be sure to watch your Spire for more information.

## COVID-19 Updates



First Baptist family,

Throughout the pandemic, First Baptist has worked to make decisions that reflect our love for our neighbor and care for our community through intentional and thoughtful practices for worship and in person gatherings. We are grateful for the ways the Spirit has been at work in our congregation in the last year and grateful to you, First Baptist, for the way you have pulled together and cared for one another. We are still here worshipping, ministering, and growing in Christ together. Throughout this period, the Church Council has met continually to evaluate circumstances and assess the best information available to guide our process. Given all of this and the changing recommendations of the Center for Disease Control (CDC), continued roll out of the Covid vaccine, and the city's revised guidelines, we want to lay out the Church Council's path forward for the months to come.

First, let me acknowledge that the transition process to a new normal will be just that, a process. We acknowledge that we will have members and friends at various stages of risk and protection from Covid. We also know that there are lessons and practices we have learned over the last year that we want to integrate into the life that is to come, such as an engaging online worship experience and hybrid small group opportunities that allow people to join our community no matter where they are. On top of this, our worship spaces and facilities have been reconfigured for over a year to wholly support virtual experiences, and that transition to a hybrid system that values online engagement as well as a meaningful in-person worship will take some time to figure out.

As we seek to balance these realities, and as we find our new normal, we will need your help and patience as we grow into these new ministry opportunities. To begin this process, the Church Council is excited to share a plan to move to two in-person worship opportunities designed to help us meet the challenges mentioned.

#### 9:15 and 11:15 Sunday Morning Worship

Beginning Sunday, June 6, we will move our outdoor, in-person, on-lawn service to 9:15 am. This will allow those who might not be ready to worship indoors the opportunity to continue worshipping outside even as the weather warms up. It will also allow for more choices during the worship experience, social distancing will still be practiced and we will ask that masks be worn at times when social distancing cannot be maintained, but during the worship service itself, individuals may choose to sing and respond without wearing a mask.

Our 11:15 am service will be a hybrid worship experience for both online and in-person, indoor worship in the sanctuary. The idea for this service will be to learn how we will move forward with a service that engages those in the room and online simultaneously. Knowing that there will be members and friends that are uncomfortable, or unable, to return to indoors worship, we do not wish to simply move back to recording the service for others to watch online apart from the community. Instead, we hope to lean into a worship experience that can be shared with our entire church family, no matter where they find themselves.

We also know that because of the age and design of our sanctuary, it does not meet the recommended air exchange rate needed for unrestricted, indoor gatherings. As such, the hybrid service will maintain social distancing in the sanctuary with designated seating areas and masks will be required at all times for attendees, even if vaccinated. We will also ask that while indoors, congregational singing be engaged in a heart-felt manner, but not at a robust volume.

Please remember that part of the reason we do this is because, while the vaccine is available to many, it is not available to all. Currently children have no option to be protected from the virus other than personal choices and the goodwill of the community. While we understand this is not the way we desire to enter into worship, we do desire to support our families and create as safe a space as possible for children and youth to be a part of in-person worship.

Our current plan is to follow this model throughout June and July to help us find our best practices for worshiping together with our church family and beyond. During this time, our Awakening and Traditional music teams will rotate leadership between services every three weeks. Throughout this process, feedback from those joining online, on-lawn, and indoor worship will be vital to shaping our future ministry opportunities. As such, we are creating a special email onechurch@fbc-columbia.org for you to share your ideas and thoughts.

#### 10:15 Sunday Morning Adult Small Groups

Adult small groups can resume in-person gatherings inside the building beginning Sunday, June 6. The Church Council has also moved to create hybrid learning spaces for that will allow some of our Sunday Morning Small Groups to have folks in-person and others online in the same small group. The idea is to create an interactive experience that brings participants together in a way that is engaging for all involved. Hopefully, this technology will be up and running by Sunday, June 6!

#### Children and Youth Ministry

#### Birth-Kindergarten

Beginning June 6, childcare will be available for children birth-kindergarten during both services. Children can be dropped off at the nursery 15 minutes before service. Babies-2 year olds will remain in the nursery and children 3 years old and up will transition to either the playground (weather permitting) or gym.

#### Children's Sunday School

During June and July, children (4 years old through 5th grade) will meet in the Fellowship Hall for Sunday School during the 10:15 hour. Children will begin with socially-distanced large group activities and then transition to smaller groups within the space for learning and play. Weather permitting, children may spend some time outside but will always begin and end in the Fellowship Hall.

Childcare will continue to be provided in the nursery for children birth-3 years old during the small group hour. We ask that children two years old and up wear a mask to the best of their ability.

## COVID-19 Update



#### Youth

Youth Sunday School will resume Sunday, June 6. Students will return to the Youth Suite on the 3rd floor and will be asked to wear their masks and remain socially distanced. Weather and space permitting, classes may spend some time outdoors, but the small group time will always begin in the Youth Suite.

#### **Safety Precautions**

Last week, mask guidelines for outdoor gatherings were updated by the Center for Disease Control. For First Baptist on-lawn gatherings, this means we ask you to wear masks at outdoor events when social distancing is not possible, but you may remove them when distance is maintained.

While Boone County recently decided to lift the mask ordinance, the CDC continues to recommend everyone wear masks while inside. Therefore, we are asking that people wear masks when inside our building for worship and other events. Fully vaccinated pastoral staff may remove masks when leading in worship from the chancel.

#### Passing the Peace

- For On-lawn worship, we will begin moving around and greeting one another during the passing of the peace.
- For Hybrid worship we will conclude with a processional to the front lawn, where we will pass the peace of Christ and fellowship together.

Throughout the summer months, we will continue to build our in-person offerings, and slowly resume other elements of our ministry as safely as possible. This plan is both careful and hopeful, and will continue the practices of planning, evaluation, and healthy experimentation we have utilized throughout this pandemic.






