


# **New Sermon Series -September 12**

The Psalms: Pursuing God in Mountains and Valleys

The Psalms are often called the prayer book of the Bible. They are a beautiful collection of prayers, poetry and songs which show us how to engage with God through the mountains and valleys of life. They contain the entire range of human emotions: despair, hope, joy, sorrow, anger, fear, thanksgiving and praise, expressed in prayer. They attest to all the feelings that arise in the ups and downs of life and they give voice to our desire and struggle to connect with God throughout life. The Psalms allow us to be honest before God. As Walter Brueggemann says, they encourage "candor about suffering and gratitude about hope."



This fall, we will get the chance to explore the Psalms together. Beginning September 12, Pastor Carol will preach on the Psalms, and we will engage with them in worship through prayer experiences and music. In addition, we are excited that Dr. Nancy deClaissé-Walford will be our Sheppard Lecture speaker and will lead us in a Bible study on the Psalms during the adult small group hour at 10:15 am on Sundays. Dr. deClaissé-Walford is an author and professor of Old Testament at the McAfee School of Theology at Mercer University in Atlanta, GA, where she has taught for 22 years.

- 9/19 It's Not a Miscellaneous Collection—the "story" of the hymnbook of ancient Israel

- 10/3 The Wonder of Joy and Celebration—singing praises with the Psalter
- 10/10 Reading the Psalter Again for the First Time—new understandings of the psalms






# First Baptist Women's Zoom

# Dedication of the Dr. Patricia J. Blair Memorial Tree

The church is invited to join the Board of Directors of A Call To Serve International and the Blair family as they dedicate a tree on the MU campus in memory of Dr. Trish Blair. The ceremony will take place from 10 am to 11 am Friday, September 24, on the Mel Carnahan Quadrangle, just east of the Reynolds Alumni Center.

Until her death in 2018, Trish was a member of First Baptist. She founded ACTS International in 1992 and relocated to Columbia in the mid-1990s. Many church members through the years have volunteered and supported her efforts to provide humanitarian aid and to promote medical, educational, religious and cultural



partnerships between the United States and the country of Georgia. In particular, Trish pursued projects to improve the health and lives of Georgian children, including medical training to reduce infant mortality rates and conducting an annual educational camp for diabetic kids.
