


Guest Preacher - October 10 Rev. Dr. Wallace S. Hartsfield II

We are excited to announce that on Sunday, October, 10, Rev. Dr. Wallace S. Hartsfield, II will be our special guest preacher in both services. Dr. Wallace S. Hartsfield is the Associate Professor of Hebrew Bible at Central Baptist Theological Seminary, Senior Pastor at Metropolitan Missionary Baptist Church (MMBC) of Kansas City, MO, and acts as the CEO of Field of Hearts Productions, a musical production company began as a joint venture between him and his wife. Rev. Dr. Hartsfield earned a PhD in Hebrew Bible at Emory University in 2005 after having earned his MDiv at the Interdenominational



Theological Center of Atlanta, GA, in 1990. Rev. Dr. Hartsfield is musically gifted as well, with a BA in Music from the University of Missouri-Kansas City Conservatory of Music.



Psalms Sermon Series - Psalm 150

Throughout our Psalms series, we have explored different types of psalms and reflected how they can companion us during the mountains and valleys of life. Psalms of Lament teach us we can bring all of our emotions before God. Zion Psalms remind us that while God dwells with us everywhere, there is something special about sacred spaces. Hymns of Trust echo what we know in our bones, that our God creates, redeems, and sustains us. On October 17, we will explore Psalm 150, the last psalm in the psalter, a beautiful Psalm of Praise. Then, on October 24, during both worship services we will sing a new psalm with an all-music Sunday and "make a joyful noise to the Lord" (Psalm 100).



First Families Pumpkin Party October 24


