Our Money Stories

As part of our series *Giving in God's Economy*, in worship on Sunday, I talked about my earliest memory about money; we all have money stories, messages, and values regarding money instilled in us from an early age. I challenged us to think about how those messages might complement or conflict with God's Economy. My money story sparked several of you to share your memories.

Charles Cantrell sent me an email with his heartwarming money story:

My paternal grandfather owned a furniture and appliance store here in Mountain View. When I was young, he had the habit of paying me a nickel when I would go to his store and hug him. My grandmother "suggested" that he should not pay me for hugs. So, he reached in his desk drawer and pulled out a pre-printed blank promissory note. He filled it in and had me sign a promissory note stating, "I promise to pay my grandpa" 50 cents plus interest. I was eight years old and supposed that entitled him to ten hugs. He then explained to my grandmother that he was not giving me nickels but only making a loan. I don't recall ever repaying the note, but he would likely say that it was repaid many times over. I still have the promissory note dated April 7, 1962.

Jen Boeckman also told me her humorous money story:

When I was in Kindergarten, I counted out 100 pennies and then proudly told my mother, "Look, I am a millionaire!" I was disappointed to learn all that money only equaled one dollar.

Joe Forsee shared this sweet memory:

My first memory of money goes back a long way. In the 1930s in Columbia, my mother used to give me a dime and send me to the grocery store at the corner of Hinkson Ave and Paris Road for a loaf of bread. At that time, a loaf of bread was nine cents. And, I got to keep the penny change. A Tootsie Roll was a penny! Guess where my penny went! My first memory of money is pretty sweet.

I wonder, what is your money story? How does it connect with God's money story of generosity, liberation, and love?

VAC Holiday Giving 2021

First Baptist is sponsoring two families this year through VAC's Holiday Program. Voluntary Action Center (VAC) is a non-profit that exists to help low-income individuals and families bridge the gap between crisis and stability and improve quality of life in Boone County. Each year VAC coordinates the collection and distribution of food and gifts for approximately 4,000 people during the holiday season.

First Baptist is participating again in this needed ministry. In addition to toys, books, and games, families often receive needed clothing and household supplies through this program. Cards with individual gift requests will be available Sunday, November 14 on the bulletin board, in the hallway, outside the Sanctuary. Get involved by choosing an item that you would like to donate, take the card, then return the purchased item to the church by December 5.

Please don't gift wrap items, but we do ask that you include the card from the bulletin board with your gift. If you worship with us online but would still like to shop for a gift, you can contact the church office Monday-Friday for our most update list of gifts. If you do not have time to shop but still want to participate, you can make a monetary donation by November 28. Simply indicate "VAC Family Christmas" on your check or offering envelope. A few of our "shopping elves" will be making a trip to pick up last minute items.
