






Advent Theme: Housing the Holy

Word from the Pastor



First Baptist family and friends,

As you know, the Child Development Center (CDC) at First Baptist has been closed since the pandemic began in March of 2020. The regulations placed on childcare facilities and the desire to keep our students and staff safe led to the closure. In the spring of 2021, the Church Council put together a Discernment Team, including Noah Hartsfield, Ken Hammann, Russ Scott, Myra Gallaway and Patty Cornell, dedicated to evaluating and making recommendations regarding the future of the Center. This fall, the Discernment Team came to the unanimous decision that it was not feasible to reopen. While there may still be a need for quality childcare in Columbia, they recognized that with no staff and no students it would take a tremendous amount of energy and funding to relaunch the CDC. After coming to this conclusion, the Discernment Team met with the remaining members of the CDC board, including Patty Cornell, Cheryl Brewer, Rebekah Robertson, Stephen Hoell, Julie Walker and Ross Kasmann. The CDC board agreed with the Discernment Team's decision and unanimously and respectfully approved the recommendation that the center be dissolved.

While we are saddened by the closure, this does not negate the incredible ministry CDC has provided to children and their families for more than 50 years! On a personal note, we moved to Columbia when Nate was two years old and shortly thereafter, he enrolled at CDC. It was an incredible gift to our family to have Nate in preschool here at the church. Both my children, Nate and Marin, received a great preschool education at First Baptist. Like mine, so many other families have been blessed by this ministry through the years.

The CDC Board has asked for a commemorative plaque to be placed in the church honoring all those who worked, volunteered, and attended CDC. When feasible, they would also like to hold a celebration commemorating the CDC. You may be wondering, what will happen to the CDC space? For the time being, the space will remain as is. We want to take some time to evaluate the future use of the space and see what new opportunities might emerge. We continue to give thanks for all the incredible board members, directors, teachers, grand-friends, music teachers, staff, volunteers, and children and their families that sustained this ministry.


Christmas Eve Service
