Announcing Brunch Worship

We are excited to announce Brunch Worship, a holy experiment with healing and connection at its center. On the first Sunday of every month, beginning February 6 and continuing through May 1, First Baptist will gather for worship around a meal and communion at 10:15 am in the Fellowship Hall. This worship service will take the place of our small groups and other worship services for that day.

Why Brunch Worship? Every year Google releases a report called the "Year in Search," which provides insight into the general ideas, feelings, and spirit of the year. The report gives a unique glimpse into the cultural climate of the year by observing the words that appeared most often in search bars across the globe. Google has recently released its report for 2021. The most frequent search in the world was "How to heal." Other top searches were related to mental health and well-being such as: "How to take care of your mental health," and "How to have hope." People are longing to recover and emerge from Covid-19 and all the turmoil of the last few years. Yet, even before the pandemic, the Surgeon General of the United States named loneliness as an epidemic in our country. We live in an age when people are in theory more connected than ever and yet more lonely and isolated. As a church, we want to be part of the healing and restoration of the world. We believe God created us to thrive in community and we are not meant to go through life alone. Brunch Worship is a chance to build community and draw people closer to God.

Our idea to do Brunch Worship emerged from our desire to build a strong and healthy community of support and mutual care at First Baptist. Brunch Worship is based on a thriving model of ministry called Dinner Church, a movement that sees gathering for a meal as worship. This is based on the model Jesus' disciples set in Acts 2, which tells us, "The believers devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, to the community, to their shared meals, and to their prayers." In the second and third centuries, when Christians gathered for worship, they celebrated what they called "love feasts," sacred shared meals with communion at the center. The early Christians came together regularly for common meals and worship around the table.

What will happen at Brunch Worship? When you arrive, you will be given a name tag and you will take a seat at a table of your choosing. We will begin with a call to worship and an opening song. Then, we will pass the peace of Christ as we fill up our plates with food. The meal will be a potluck. You are invited to contribute to worship by bringing whatever entrée, dessert, fruit, salad, muffin, or store-bought contribution you want to make! After our plates are full, we will take some time to eat and converse. After we will hear a scripture reading, listen to a short reflection or a discussion question, and explore scripture together through discussion. Finally, we will sing, pray, and clean up together.

All children and youth are invited to be full participants in Brunch Worship. Childcare will continue to be available for children from birth through kindergarten. A Virtual Brunch Worship option will be available via Zoom for our church family who cannot join us in person.

We look forward to the ways that we will grow as a community of faith as we worship God through a shared meal, song, conversation, and communion. While this may look and feel different, from other worship services and fellowship opportunities, we hope it will foster a meaningful connection with God and with one another. During this holy experiment, we trust that God will meet us in sacred conversation and broken bread as we gather around the brunch table.

- 2021 Year-to-Date Actual Expenditures- \$611,710 as of Dec 1
- 2021 Pledged Contributions- \$270,538
- 2021 Year-to-Date Pledges received- \$240,201
- 2021 Unpledged Contributions Budgeted- \$30,000

Year-to-Date Giving Statements

The church will be sending out year-to-date giving statements through November this week in an effort to ensure that our contribution records match the personal records of those who have contributed this year. We started this practice last year because of several changes in our system of checks and balances and it was helpful. Our desire is to be as accurate as possible with our records before sending out tax documents in 2022. If you find any discrepancies in your statement, please contact Michael McEntyre for assistance. If no changes are required, any December contributions will be added to the statements and official tax documents will be sent out in January. If you give online, you can always check your contributions by logging into your account. Just as a reminder, for financial gifts to be included on your 2021 statement of charitable contributions, donations must be received in the church office by December 30 (as the office is closed on the 31) or dated and postmarked (either by mail or electronically if giving online) by December 31.


Unidiversity Youth Camp

Trustees Project Report

As we come together to celebrate this Advent season you may have noticed several updates around the church. The Trustees have been hard at work this Fall to line up several projects for the months to come. Most recently we have repaired/ replaced the parking lot sidewalk entrance and created a walkway into the parking lot from the Elevator Lobby sidewalk to allow easier access to our new ADA parking spaces. This is the first of several sidewalk updates scheduled for the months ahead. Next will be a reconstruction of the south Waugh Street sidewalk that leads to the choir area. This area consistently holds water and creates a freezing hazard each winter. Other areas will be addressed through to spring as weather permits.

On top of the concrete work, the Trustees worked to replace the failing double doors to the Children's Building hallway with large new insulated glass doors complete with ADA compliant automation to allow push button assisted opening for those who need it. This was part of our visioning process to assist with accessibility to our building. We are also in the process of adding automation to the Children's Building door to the courtyard and the sanctuary entrance from the courtyard to allow for handicap access to the sanctuary from this part of the church. Push bar exits have also been installed on the south Waugh Street door for security purposes and assisted access.

First Baptist Ski Trip Tentatively Set for 2023

After looking at the responses to our interest meeting and email inquiries, there are too many personal conflicts with a 2022 Spring Break ski trip next year for us to meet the minimum requirements for discounts. As such, we will move our trip planning to 2023 and gauge interest next fall for a possible trip.


