He moved to Columbia in 2010 when his wife, Candace Kuby, took a faculty position as an assistant professor of early childhood education at the University of Missouri. Foster has also served as pastor at University Baptist Church in Montevallo, Alabama; he later served with Passport, Inc. in Birmingham as a camp coordinator and project director. Foster also is known as a storyteller, speaking in a variety of settings nationwide.
