A Statement of Faith (unison)

Now the Jesus Film people are looking to dub several more Romani dialects in Ukraine. Keith will be helping with other minority language projects in this hemisphere, as well as continued work with Faith Comes By Hearing. In the past few months, he has visited Iceland and Spain to discuss potential recording projects there.
