Colossians 2:9-15

For in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily, and you have come to fullness in him, who is the head of every ruler and authority. In him also you were circumcised with a spiritual circumcision, by putting off the body of the flesh in the circumcision of Christ; when you were buried with him in baptism, you were also raised with him through faith in the power of God, who raised him from the dead. #### Models of Atonement

#### **Christus Victor (Victory Model):**

The Christus Victor Model of the atonement was the dominate model of the atonement for the first 1,000 year of the Church. It says that God created the world good and holy. However, humanity sinned and rebelled against God. When that happened, we became entrapped by the forces of evil and sin. In fact, some of that darkness and brokenness now resides in us. As a result, we are both victims and culprits. We are entrapped in a cycle of sin and death, which we perpetuate by continuing to sin.

Therefore, Jesus came in to the world to set us free. In an act of sacrificial love, Jesus took on the power of evil and it got him killed. When Jesus died, it looked like evil won. BUT then God raised him from the dead. With that he conquered sin and death. So, through Christ, we can be free. We don't have to be held captive to sin and death anymore.

Satisfaction (Payment Model): God's holiness and justice demands that debt of sin be paid. Jesus' death pays the price for human sin.

Moral Influence Model: People are moved by the love of God displayed in Christ's self-giving death. Jesus' life and death is then a catalyst; the power of the Holy Spirit will transform human beings and the world.

Scapegoat Model: Jesus is a victim of human violence and sin. His death on the cross reveals humanity's propensity to violence and overcomes it by submitting to it.

Solidarity Model: Jesus died in solidarity with us, he underwent the ultimate consequences of living in a sinful world, in order to demonstrate the depths of God's love and God's desire to save us.
